As part of our workshop, DA Townsville will be hosting a "Come & Try Day" on Sunday 7th March, from 10 a.m. to 12 noon on the beach near the Sailing Club, to promote the sport to the local community, and to build interest in forming a sports team.

2010 will see QDBF send many experienced and qualified dragon boat personnel to clubs to assist and to share their knowledge.

It has been a busy couple of months what with the AGM being late, Christmas and the States coming up, we also had the added work load due to the requirement to adopt the AusDBF Rules of Racing and to attend the AusDBF Presidents meeting to ratify those Rules.



The committee has settled in and is working well as a team with each individual committee member having their own issues and roles to work on with support from each other, we have a lot of work to clear up this year but we will get there.

Looking Forward

- On Line registration, AusDBF have adopted a online registration system which QDBF signed up for last year so we will be having a look at how it works and will provide feedback and information to clubs as soon as we can
- Sweep Manuals, AusDBF are rewriting the sweep manuals and Dallas has submitted feedback from our Queensland coaches to AusDBF
- Development, our Risk Management Plan and Development Plan need rewriting and we have begun on this. QDBF will also be applying for more Development Grants for next year when the Sports & Recreation Department have received the approved program from the Queensland Government

From a paddlers point of view I, like everybody else, am ramping up my training regime to perform at my best in the Queensland State Titles and maybe as a member of the Queensland Representative Team for Adelaide so good luck to all and I will see you on the water (hopefully not a view from behind), lets hope we have a good and full regatta season.

Great Grand Masters

Continuing from where we left off at the 2009 Australian Championships at Lake Kawana, I wish to confirm that Great Grand Dragon Category is still attracting an enormous amount of interest nationally.

In April 2009, Queensland had 72 paddlers on our data base; this number has dropped marginally over the past twelve months. The AusBDF Rules & Regulations of Racing prevent doubling up of divisions and has reduced the spectacle of what would have been a huge showing in Adelaide; if last year's demonstrational races were an indicator.

On each race day we had eight boatloads of 60 + year olds using every bit of muscle and sweat paddling their boats down the course to a rousing reception at the finish line.

Subject to continuing support, 2010 Australian Championships will be the 1st Official Race of this Division (GGD) in Australia. Unfortunately, it would appear this will only be in the Mixed Category due to the above mentioned ruling. Be that as it may, we have approximately 28 paddlers striving for a place on the team to represent Queensland as trailblazers in this historic race.
